Recommendation: Governance



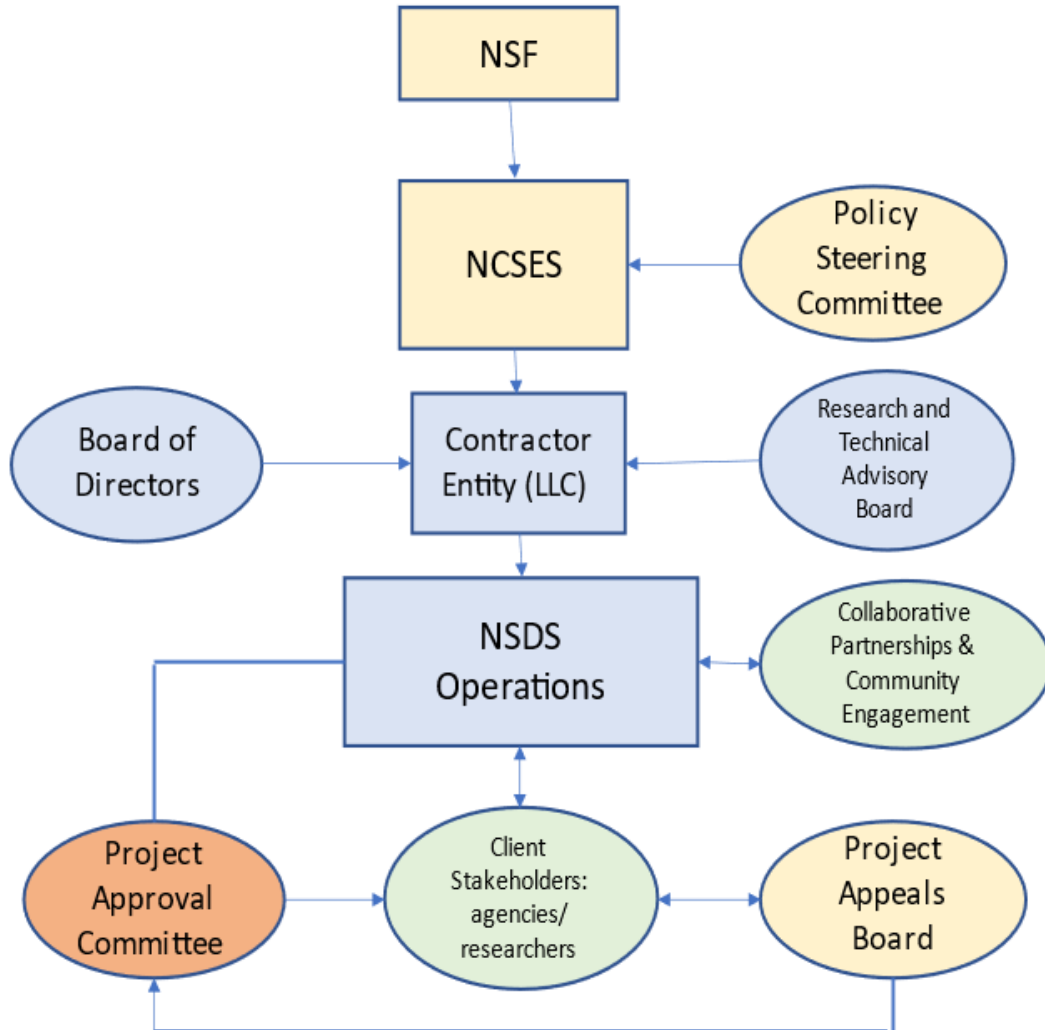
The ADC will need a centralized management structure

- Collaborative system guided by a coherent body and governance process
- Centralized structure coordinates a group of ADC nodes

The ADC will need to continuously produce value

- Add additional features, as needed
- Implement efficient, timely, and transparent business processes
- Help identify and resolve agency bottlenecks
- Receive funding through Federal appropriations and through user charges and partnership/cooperative agreement revenue
